

Use of the Known Sites Database

The Interagency Known Sites Database is site information that has been collected by incident management teams, jurisdictional agencies, and fire protection agencies. This database contains location information, protection information, and management contact information.

This data can be provided to incident management teams and Incident Commanders for development of structure protection plans. The following information should be provided to the teams:

- This database is not complete, because there is no site in the database should not be conclusive proof that no site exists.
- Information contained with the database include:
 - A unique identification number
 - A land manager identification number
 - Protection level
 - Management contact
 - Latitude/Longitude
 - Who collected the data
 - How the data was collected
 - Whether the data is confidential
 - Whether there is a structure on the site
 - Whether there is equipment on the site (i.e. towers, RAWs, communications)
 - Whether the site is historic
 - A general description of the site
- Sites designated in the database as Confidential should not be displayed on any maps outside necessary operational personnel.
- Any data that the team collects shall be provided back to the Agency Administrator. This should include any changes to the existing data.
