## **70.0 PROCEDURES FOR ORDERING EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES**

- A. Requests for supplies and equipment for fire suppression or an emergency incident will be processed through the resource ordering system. All NFES supplies and equipment ordered shall reference the appropriate NFES catalog number.
- B. AICC will accept orders for supplies and equipment from AFS zone offices, DOF regional offices, and the USFS Forests if they are unable to fill orders internally. AFS zone offices can place requests for cache supply items directly to the Alaska Cache except for items that will be delivered by paracargo.
- C. Any suppression-related vehicle requests will be ordered through AICC.

### **70.1 AFS WAREHOUSE SYSTEM**

The AFS warehouse in Fairbanks is a National Cache. In addition to the main facility located in Fairbanks, there are satellite caches in Galena, Ft. Yukon and Tanana. All locations report to the Fairbanks cache for technical direction and to zone management for daily and line direction.

### **70.2 DOF WAREHOUSE SYSTEM**

DOF maintains Regional warehouses at Fairbanks and Palmer. Initial attack caches are maintained at McGrath, Tok, Delta, Haines, and Soldotna.
