HIGHLIGHTS:

- Currently 17 fires are active in Alaska. Five of the fires are staffed and the rest are in monitor status. So far this year the Alaska Interagency Coordination Center (AICC) reports 179 fires statewide have burned nearly 110,500 acres statewide. The AICC coordinates fire management resources for the BLM Alaska Fire Service, the Alaska Division of Forestry and the U.S. Forest Service.
