HIGHLIGHTS

- Though the Interior received some light precipitation overnight, there continue to be Red Flag Warnings in effect for of the all of the Northern and a portion of the Eastern Interior for high winds throughout today.
- There were four new fires yesterday. One near the University of Alaska Fairbanks was suppressed successfully; another on the outskirts of Stebbins Village was contained, and two, one northeast of Fort Yukon and one east of Arctic Village, that are currently being monitored.
- A Temporary Flight Restriction (TFR) is still in effect for the Parks Highway Fire. For additional information on the specifics of the TFR go to the following web site: <http://airspace.nifc.gov/mapping/nifc>
- Currently 15 fires are active in Alaska. Three fires are staffed and the rest are in monitor status. So far this year the Alaska Interagency Coordination Center (AICC) reports 185 fires statewide have burned nearly 139,681 acres statewide.
