Growth to East and SE

Refocusing protection along Sterling hwy along SE corner

Los Padres IHC demob'ing off today

Remains hot/dry on the fire

During recon flight last night, IC stated their fire was the only one not standing up
Critical need: Requesting shooter

8. 361 Lloyd

Moderate fire behavior on NE side

All structures prepped

Nearest point to fire, still 3 miles away

Big fire, lots of logistical concerns with being stretched out and distance to aviation fuels

9. 312 Bergman

Moderated fire behavior

Looking at a number of other allotments, which will require some crew action

10. 409 Rainbow 2

Ordering T3 team

11. 349 Chandalar River

Exciting day, impressive fire behavior

Multiple allotment protection actions in place

One edge of fire hooked around, lost part of their camp and some hose lay

12. 337 Hadweenzie

Has kids camp at mouth of river, 20 children plus staff currently

Sent 8 SMKJ's there this morning

6 SMKJ's previously out there will be coming off tomorrow

Getting more active, anticipating doing some burning out
