Coffee Brief

Date: July 10, 2019

Weather Summary

Temperatures will start to moderate a bit, and any areas with smoke can expect cooler temperatures as well.

The area of convection will become more widespread over the southern 2/3 of the state in the next few days. Short waves moving down from the north will be the culprit behind activity in eastern Alaska over this period.

At this time, it looks like the center of the high moves off the northwest coast and stretches apart, which will decrease temperature some and allow a chance for waves with showers and thunderstorms to roll through late in the week and into the weekend. Though wetting rains may occur in the south, storms will be mostly dry in the north. Overall, high pressure builds back in over the weekend, though a weaker system will bring milder temperatures than we've seen this last week or so. The CPC 2-wk forecasts continue to show little to no relief.

A Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory has been issued for Alaska.

Fuels/Fire Potential

All indices are highlighting South Central, Copper River Basin, Upper Yukon, and west of the Alaska Range with Extreme values. This will support significant growth where active fires exist. FWI shows that lightning ignition and resistance to control is widespread. Spruce Adjectives reinforce this, and indicate potential for a major event.

Smoke is impacting solar heating across the southern 2/3 of the state. This has been slowing fire activity with reports of creeping and single tree torching vs those without smoke describing running and torching. Expect this to continue, though the relief is only temporary and any sunshine will quickly step up fire behavior.

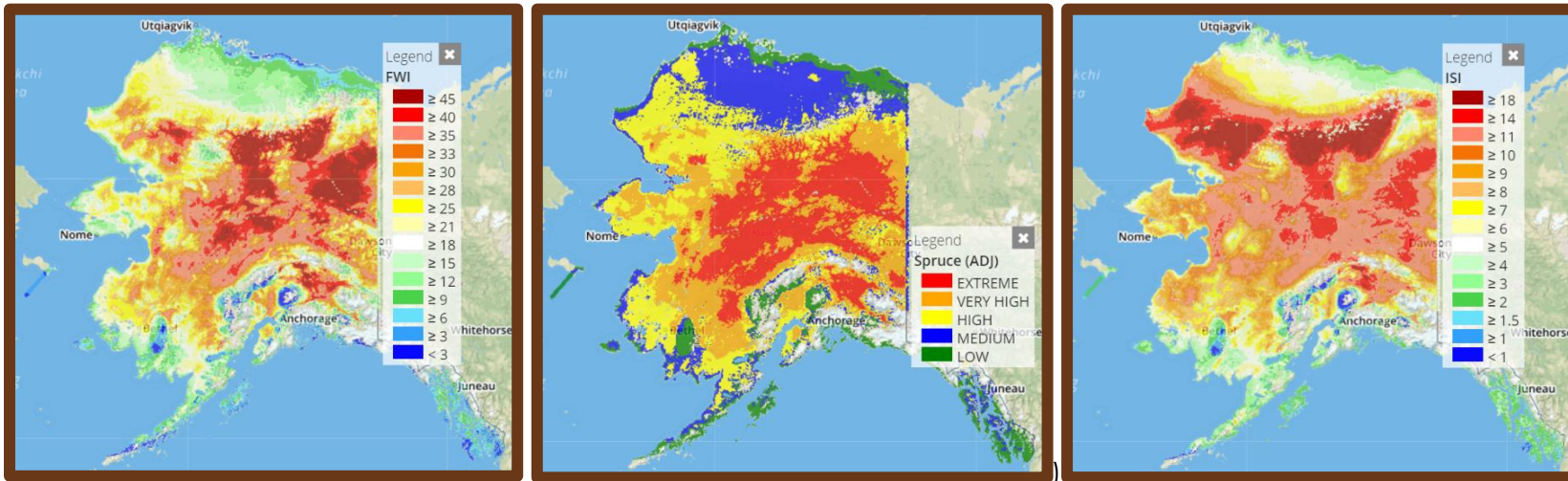
