Coffee Brief

Date: July 16, 2019

Weather Summary

The weather pattern will allow scattered showers and widely scattered wet thunderstorms over Alaska's Interior over the next few days. With recent moistening of the atmosphere, most thunderstorms are expected to be dry. Temperatures are substantially less hot than the previous week. This trend toward moderation in temperatures, combined with some rainfall and an overall increase in the moisture content of the atmosphere in the southern Interior, has allowed RH values to climb.

A change in weather pattern is possible by late this week, with a chance for temperatures to drop slightly below seasonal normals. This potential change in weather regime does not look, at this time, like it will be accompanied by widespread heavy rains, but a chance of rain is possible.

Areas that received rain recently have seen some improvement in air quality as the rains have scrubbed out some of the PM 2.5 particulates. Smoke will thicken again in coming days, as fire activity picks up again.

Fuels/Fire Potential

The Buildup Index (BUI) remains near record levels in the Upper Yukon Valley, the western Interior, and portions of south-central Alaska. Where fine fuels are dry, expect significant fire growth potential.

The Spruce Adjective Ratings has been performing well lately. Today's latest Spruce Adjective highlights the overall potential in the Upper Yukon Valley, the northwestern Galena Zone, the Copper River Basin, and the Tanana Valley.

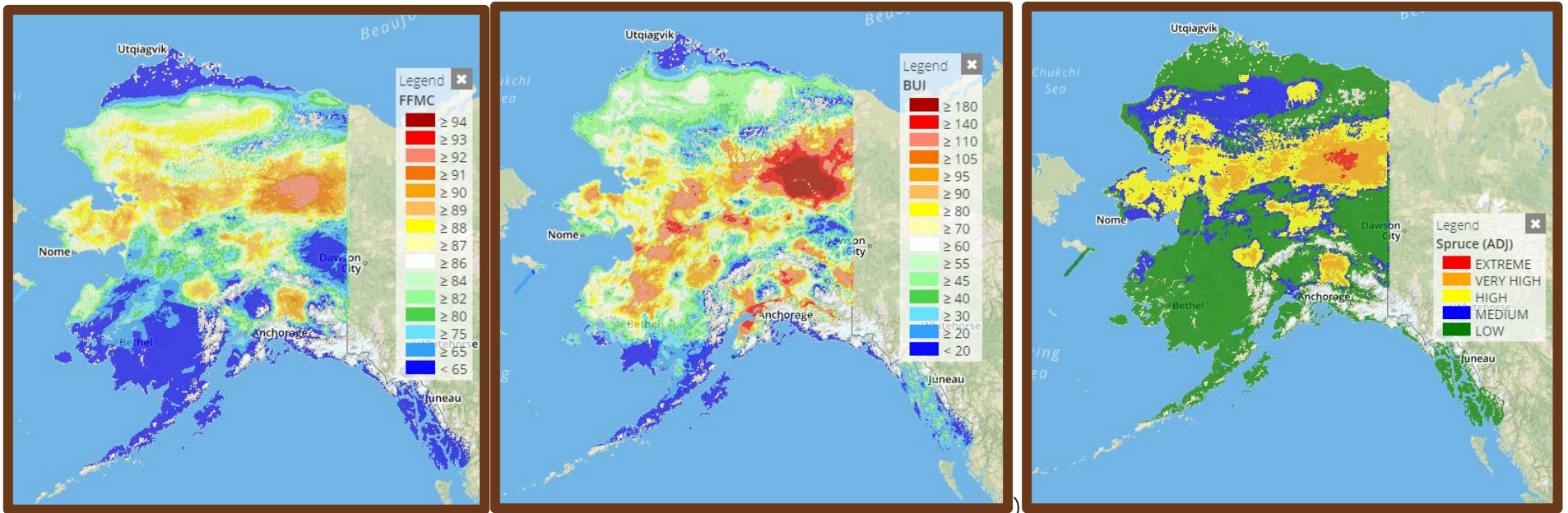
