Coffee Brief

Date: July 5, 2019

Weather Summary

High pressure over southern Alaska continues to bring hot and dry weather to South Central and Copper River Basin. The ridge is expected to strengthen today, bringing hotter, drier weather to the Panhandle and Southwest Alaska. Tomorrow, the ridge begins to shift northward, and hotter, drier weather will move into the Interior, as well. By the weekend, the entire state is expected to have temperatures in the 70s and 80s, and even 90s, while relative humidity will bottom out in the mid to low 20s. Record high temperatures are anticipated at some locations.

At this time, it looks like the center of the high moves up into western Alaska, which will keep hot and dry weather for most of the state into early next week. At this point, there isn't a reliable breakdown of the ridge in the next 7 days.

Fuels/Fire Potential

Extreme Fine Fuel Moisture Codes (FFMCs) and elevated Initial Spread Indices (ISIs) in the Mat-Su, Copper River and areas of the Kenai Peninsula illustrate the continued potential for new ignitions, as well as the likelihood of significant fire spread.

Spruce Adjectives remain very high to extreme in these same areas, as well as the Upper Yukon Zone. Though many locations in the west and north have received some rainfall and show much lower values, expect these areas to become elevated in the next few days with intense heat and drying

Areas that have received little or no rain continue to dry, even with cooler temperatures and higher RH values. These do not moderate deeper drying, but allow it to continue, increasing resistance to control and extinguishment.

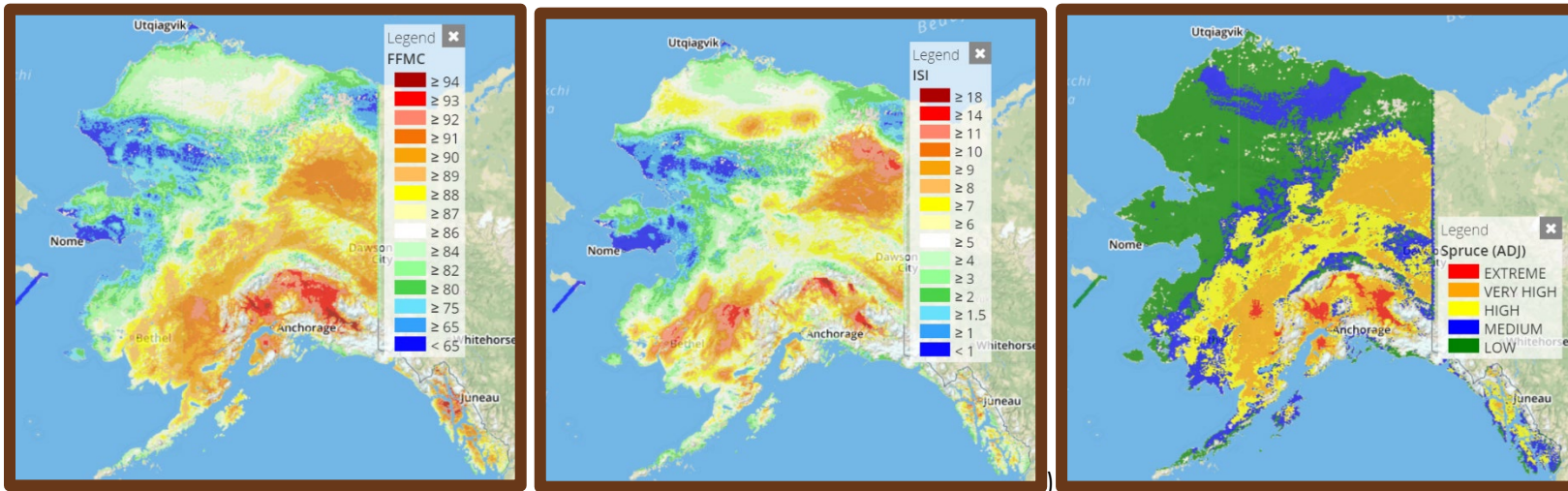
