<p><b>1</b> <b>Fire: 319 Shovel Creek</b> <b>IC: Chris Allen</b></p>	<p>Alex 18,558 acres Quite a bit of increase due to burnout 15% contained 852 personnel \$14.2M No significant changes to 209 Community meeting last night went really well because we were able to work with the borough to reduce some evacuation levels Perfect Perch and Martin, total of 52 residences removed from Level 3, to level 2 Critical resource needs listed on 209 Getting clarity on IA responsibility and being able to prepared to respond within the planning area.</p>
<p><b>2</b> <b>Fire: 181 Swan Lake</b> <b>IC: Gales</b></p>	<p>Lonnie Click 100,027 acres 41% contained 415 personnel \$14.4M No significant changes to 209 Moderate fire behavior with mop up continuing on the south and west sides along the hwy Community meeting tonight @1800 at Cooper Landing</p>

<p><b>3</b></p> <p><b>Fire: 429 Montana Creek / 451 Malaspina</b></p> <p><b>IC: Craig Glazier</b></p>	<p>Craig Glazier, IC w/NW12</p> <p>To assist state with IA activity took over end of shift last night</p> <p>Both fires at 30% containment</p> <p>Montana acres: 267</p> <p>Malaspina acres:85</p> <p>Continue to mop up on both fires.</p> <p>Critical resource needs: one add'l crew and 5 engines needed, T3-6, any of them would be appreciated.</p> <p>No accidents/injuries</p>
<p><b>4</b></p> <p><b>Fire: 362 Boundary River / 133 McArthur</b></p> <p><b>IC: NIMO</b></p>	<p>Boundary:</p> <p>Keeping fire west of the Nabesna River and had opportunity to do a burn out on SE corner of that to help secure</p> <p>2 crews timing out today</p> <p>If we get replacements on crews we can continue with this operation to try and get around and there is a fire scar on the west side and if we tie into that, it will take out the values with the allotments and the village of Northway. This is our #1 priority for today</p> <p>McArthur:</p> <p>Limited resources</p> <p>South: concern is as it's moving around, the finer fuels, if we get a wind push it could severely impact Alaska Hwy.</p> <p>Critical resources on 209 is still valid</p> <p>Per Robert (DOF): ensuring you are coordinating with the Yukon Territory on McArthur fire for any movements or information along the border. Yes</p>

<p><b>6</b></p> <p><b>Fire: 391 NinetyEight Creek/390 Beaver</b></p> <p><b>IC: Ricky Cox</b></p>	<p>One crew and minimal overhead in place, out on Sunday</p> <p>Small piece of internal heat still buried in jack straw</p> <p>Looking very well</p> <p>Beaver:</p> <p>9,000 acres</p> <p>0% contained</p> <p>\$15K</p>

<p><b>7</b>  <b>Fires: 409 Rainbow 2</b>  <b>IC: Goyette</b></p>	<p>Thomas IC(t)  Transferring from T4 to T3  5,000 acres  0% contained  \$120K  Moderate fire activity with short range spotting  May ask for a couple crews for support of the black line operations</p>
<p><b>8</b>  <b>Fires: 461 Klutina River</b>  <b>IC: Zack Horner</b></p>	<p>100+ acres 0% contained  30 personnel  May have doubled overnight  8 SMJK's  2/3 of Gannett Glacier crew currently on fire  Concerns: very high indices, red flag warning, expect significant fire growth if we don't get air support.  IC states fire is still catchable if we can get the air support and we will also need crews  NR T2IMT inbrief tomorrow evening</p>
