AICC Report	Nationally NICC remains at PL2 Most geographic areas reporting light IA, SW reporting moderate Tactical desk very busy One more order for jet load late last night, scheduled out through 16th
1 Fire: 319 Shovel Creek IC: Rob Allen	23,734 acres 60% contained \$16.5M 739 personnel Lost one outbuilding Rain on most of fire over evening Working on back hauling stuff out Safety concerns: if not able to fly, Medivac via ground if needed Thunderstorms coming through today Issue with flu affecting finance section-may reach out to team on standby to borrow a time recorder
2 Fire: 181 Swan Lake IC: Brian Gales	100,027 acres 50% contained 423 personnel Resource: could free up one crew (T2 IA) and perhaps a T1 helicopter Inbrief EA team tomorrow at 1800, shadow Sunday w/close out at 1100 and team will transition on Monday at 0800
3 Fire: 466 Chalkyitsik Complex IC:	0% contained 160 personnel \$350K Bearnose fire increased about 50K acres, all are active
