<b>AICC Report</b>	AK remains at PL5 4 new fires for 42 acres 163,000 acres of growth on 217 active fires 6 air tankers, 4 scoopers, 3 air attack, 4 ASM/lead, 3 bird dogs, 8 fire bosses, 8 loads SMJ at three bases: FAI, GAL and McGrath
<b>1</b> <b>Fire: 466 Chalkyitsik Complex</b> <b>IC: Tom Kurth T2</b>	414,000 acres, gain of 57,000 acres over last 36 hours 0% contained 235 personnel with 7 crews Safety: tree blow down in cabin areas and where burns have been established for quite some time. Critical needs: looking for two crews to replace crews timing out Busy ICP: buying team, JICC, NIMO and our team overhead are here at Tanana Middle School, so lots of traffic over here.
<b>2</b> <b>Fire: 319 Shovel Creek</b> <b>IC: Fry T2</b>	21,209 acres 51% contained \$23M 477 personnel No changes to 209 One allergic reaction, taken to hospital and doing okay Transition to light T3 IMT on Wednesday after shift
<b>3</b> <b>Fire: 181 Swan Lake</b> <b>IC: Pisarek EA T2 IMT</b>	102,027 acres 72% contained 315 personnel \$21.8M No significant changes Safety concerns: Heavy Sterling Hwy traffic with dip net season

<b>4</b> <b>Fires: Kobe</b> <b>IC: Aaron Kendall T3</b>	Transition today with new IMT and will take over this afternoon 896 acres 40% contained \$1.3M 165 personnel
<b>5</b> <b>Fire: 485 Grouse</b> <b>IC: Jaime Long IMT3</b>	15,500 acres for Grouse 3,600 acres for Garnett 0% contained \$850K 88 personnel Eye injury: wood imbedded in eye, got checked out and should be back to work tomorrow. Safety concerns: fire weakened trees and snags, plus boats and bears

<b>7</b> <b>Fire: Rainbow 2</b> <b>IC: Zumhofe</b>	14,000 acres IR flight scheduled today 0% contained 80 personnel \$996K No changes to 209 Safety concerns: river corridor and boat activity
<b>8</b> <b>Fire: McGrath Fires</b> <b>IC: Seth</b>	64 fires, 4 staffed Just under ½ million acres Thanks for support with WY T3 IMT mines, it's helped
