### AICC Report and Fire Updates by Incident

<p><b>AICC Report</b> <b>Stephanie Childs</b></p>	<p>3 new fires for 64 acres 255 active fires and 24 staffed fires Still light activity in L48 - Northwest, Northern California and Rocky Mtn had an uptick in activity Crews are being mobilized to the Northwest and availability of crews is diminishing.</p>
<p><b>1</b> <b>Fire: #466 Chalkyitsik Complex</b> <b>IC: Norm McDonald</b></p>	<p>496,000 acres; 0% contained; 319 personnel; \$6.3 million Have a process to show work completed on structure and allotment protection that they will start using New start to west of complex (#687) that they helped initial attack and will add to the complex per the Upper Yukon Zone's request; 2 crews ordered Continued direct line and mop up around village; working south to Ohtig Lake and are waiting to burn around an allotment on Ohtig Lake Mopping up on the north end; there is active fire in oxbows and potential is there for spread Smoke lifted and were able to fly allotments and structures on the east along the Black River; all structures still standing and allotments haven't been impacted Will be looking at allotments and structures on the south today Moving ICP but internet issues at new site that have to be worked out Needs – shooters and shotguns for increased bear interactions No available resources for reassignment</p>
<p><b>2</b> <b>Fire: #899 Cornucopia Complex</b></p>	<p>89,512 acres; \$6.5 million Moved ICP to pipeline training center 3 point protection fires and 8 monitor fires</p>

<b>IC: Bea Day</b>	Holding and improving lines on Hadweenzic, Tony Slough and Chandalar River fires and looking for window to burn Strategic planning meeting today with agency administrators at ICP at 1500 Needs – 2 crews
<b>3 Fire: #485 Grouse Creek IC: Fabian Montano (t)</b>	Grouse Creek - 50,418 acres; 5% contained; 87 personnel; \$1.6 million Garnet Creek – 9,000 acres Received area-wide precip; little movement on fire Sent a division up to Dalton Highway to assess risks if fire reaches there Continuing point protection on Native allotments and structures Garnet Creek hasn't moved much; pretty much hung up where fuels are unavailable Concerns – bears and boat travel with low visibility on river in morning Needs – none
<b>4 Fire: #181 Swan Lake IC: Greg Peterson (deputy)</b>	102,229 acres; 79% contained; 190 personnel; \$24.1 million 1.17 inches of rain at RAWs station in last couple of days Minimal fire activity with mainly smoldering Finished suppression repair and chipping operations should be done early next week Eastern Area short T2 team will be taking over fire tomorrow No concerns No needs
<b>5 Fire: #319 Shovel Creek IC: Thomas Krock (t)</b>	22,000 acres; 56% contained; 32 personnel; \$24 million Light precip yesterday – less than one-quarter inch Logistics and finance still closing stuff out Continue rehab work today and tying in with resource advisors; 3-4 shifts for rehab completion Concerns – slick roads and increased recreational traffic No needs No resources available for reassignment
<b>6 Fire: Rainbow 2 IC: Ashleigh D'Antonio (t)</b>	18,750 acres; 0% contained; 73 personnel; \$1.8 million Minimal activity due to rain and still raining today Some activity on NW, SW and SE corners Trying to wrap and secure line around northwest corner to protect Richardson Clearwater community Concerns – logistical challenges Needs – none; got all resources requested and will be trickling resources out in the next couple days
<b>7 Fire: Southwest Area IC: Seth Ross</b>	500,000 acres, 68 active fires and 6 staffed; 104 personnel Still focusing on #534 Smith Creek, #490 Tony Slough and #487 McCally Creek Widespread rain but not all fires got precip In demobe cycle and rightsizing some fires by attrition
