**AICC Report and Fire Updates by Incident**

<b>AICC Report:</b> <b>Stephanie Childs</b>	1 new fire for one-tenth of an acre yesterday 253 active fires, 23 staffed fires National – mostly at moderate initial attack; uptick in activity in Northern Rockies and Northwest; resources still available Jet load #20 schedule to arrive in Fairbanks tomorrow
<b>1</b> <b>Fire: #466 Chalkyitsik Complex</b> <b>IC: Norm McDonald</b>	496,000 acres; 19% completion; 341 personnel Completion percentage is for allotments and structures protected and amount of contained control line. #687 – new start from two days ago; little over 30 acres; put 2 crews on it and expect over a week of work; lot of dead and down with heavy mop up Mop up on Chalkyitsik Complex is going well but it's slow going because of how deep fire is burning Inserted TCC crew into 2 cabins off Draanjik River to mop up and secure line around structures. Concerns – lot of bears; local resident shot a bear outside a camp on airstrip yesterday Needs -none No resources available for reassignment
<b>2</b> <b>Fire: #899 Cornucopia Complex</b> <b>IC: Bea Day</b>	89,512 acres; \$6.8 million; Staffed fires -all in hold and improve pattern; waiting for opportunity to burn. Shot a nuisance bear yesterday on Hadweenzic Fire. Lot of crew movement today with crews coming back to Fairbanks Strategy meeting yesterday with agency administrators – on glide path to downsize incident.

<b>3</b> <b>Fire: #485 Grouse Creek/#576 Garnet Creek</b> <b>IC: Fabian Montano (t)</b>	<p>Grouse creek – 50,418 acres, 5% contained; 87 personnel; \$1.7 million  Garnet Creek – 9,043 acres  Both fires got some precip and still light, steady showers falling today on both fires.  Prepping along Native allotments and isolated structures.  Potential for smoke along Dalton Highway but rain should help moderate smoke</p>
<b>4</b> <b>Fire: #181 Swan Lake</b> <b>IC: Brad Witkin (t)</b>	<p>102,229 acres; 79% completion; 148 personnel; \$24.2 million  Transitioned to short T2 team today at 0800 and scheduled to go back to home unit at EOS 7/31.  No changes to 209  Over 2 inches of rain in last 2-3 days.  Continuing suppression repair and backhaul.  All spike camps will be closed by EOS today.  Concerns – heavy recreational traffic associated with dip netting season.  Needs – none.  No resources available for reassignment.</p>
<b>5</b> <b>Fire: #319 Shovel Creek</b> <b>IC: Thomas Krock (t)</b>	<p>22,000 acres; 56% contained; 35 personnel; \$24 million  Still smoldering on the northern edge closest to Chatanika River.  Light precip on fire.  Mopping up around structures.  Found and backhauled more supplies that had been burned over and left behind.  Continue to patrol, mop up and monitor.  Mapping mission today to assess any growth in the last couple of days.  Will transition to T4 IC on Aug. 2 and closing ICP at Pearl Creek Elementary on Aug. 1.  Concerns – high recreational traffic, i.e. berry pickers; steep, slippery conditions; civilians accessing dozer lines.</p>
<b>6</b> <b>Fire: #409 Rainbow 2</b> <b>IC: Ashleigh D’Antonio (t)</b>	<p>19,700 acres; 0% contained; 91 personnel; \$1,880,000.  New acreage the result of helicopter mapping mission yesterday.  Minimal fire activity.  Continue securing north edge moving west to wrap the northwest corner and reduce threat to Richardson Clearwater community.  Still finding spot fires from a week ago between the main fire and Clear Creek.  Crew swap today.  Needs – T3 finance section chief.</p>
<b>7</b> <b>Fire: Southwest Area (McGrath)</b> <b>IC: Seth Ross</b>	<p>68 active fires, 5 staffed.  Demobed one fire yesterday and released some smokejumpers.  Put in request for DRTI mission.  Heavy precip on some fires and no precip on other fires.  No accidents or injuries.</p>
