AICC Report and Fire Updates by Incident

<p>AICC Report: Stephanie Childs</p>	<p>No new fires. 254 active fires; 20 staffed fires. National update - light activity yesterday; Northern Rockies, Northwest and northern California are most active; resources are becoming less available.</p>
<p>1 Fire: #466 Chalkyitsik Complex IC: Norm McDonald</p>	<p>499,598 acres; 55% complete; 354 personnel; \$7.6 million. Majority of effort is on #687; two crews and jumpers are securing line and mopping up. Strategic planning meeting today at ICP. Looking to burn around allotment on Ohtig Lake. Mopping up around structures in Draanjik River corridor. Minor injury - burn to arm by pump muffler. Concerns – snags and bears; seeing more snags.</p>
<p>2 Fire: #899 Cornucopia Complex IC: Bea Day</p>	<p>5% contained and 90% of objectives completed; 493 personnel; \$7.7 million. Looking at how to show some kind of completion/containment similar to Chalkyitsik Complex. No changes from 209. Chandalar River – burned another ¾ of a mile; getting some new crews in so that should help. Hadweenzic – holding and waiting for conditions to burn. Tony Slough – prepping around several additional allotments; waiting for window to burn. Another tree strike – crew member was treated for a concussion and released.</p>
<p>3</p>	<p>Grouse Creek - 52,000 acres; 5% contained; 87 personnel; \$2.4 million. Garnet Creek – 9,043 acres; 0% contained.</p>

<p>Fire: #485 Grouse Creek and #576 Garnett Creek IC: Fabian Montano (t)</p>	<p>Precip over fire yesterday. Releasing 9-person fire use module today so will be down to 78 personnel. Flew the fire yesterday and found isolated heat on the line; about 80% of the perimeter is cold. Local T3 organization is coming in; shadow day will be on Thursday and TOC at EOS Thursday. Community meeting at 1500 on Thursday. Concerns – snags and boating operations. Needs – none.</p>
<p>4 Fire: #181 Swan Lake IC: Brad Witkin (t)</p>	<p>102,000 acres; 80% complete; 113 personnel; \$24.7 million. Fire is mainly being monitored. Good air yesterday allowed for lots of backhaul to be removed. TFR was lifted last night. Some closures are being lifted. Going back to local frequencies. One medical – dehydration; person is on light duty today. Gannett Glacier T2IA crew was assigned to a new fire, which leaves them with one T2IA crew. Transfer back to the local unit tomorrow at 1200.</p>
<p>5 Fire: #319 Shovel Creek IC: Thomas Krock (t)</p>	<p>224,83 acres; 22 personnel; 56% contained; \$24 million New mapping showed 1,500-acre gain in past week. Mopping up southern edge of fire. Smoldering on northern perimeter; when sun comes out it pops its head up; considering putting rappellers in there. T2 rotor with rappellers available on Aug. 2. Concerns – wet, slippery roads and increased recreational traffic. Transitioning to T4 organization today.</p>
<p>6 Fire: #409 Rainbow 2 IC: Ashleigh D’Antonio (t)</p>	<p>19,757 acres; 5% contained; 120 personnel; \$2.2 million. Started mopping up on NE side and going direct on NW side with crews now that have more personnel. Using bucket drops to keep NW corner in check south of where crews are working; can’t put crews in there due to UXO in area. Two medicals yesterday – sick crew member transported to Fairbanks and traumatic injury last night at 2000 that require helo extraction and transport to Fairbanks; both patients are doing well and back at ICP today. No needs</p>
<p>7 Fire: #324 Hess Creek IC: Tim Sherwin (t)</p>	<p>185,185 acres; 60% complete on objectives; 76 personnel; \$2.844,148 No significant changes to 209. Fire has been calm; continuing to patrol and mopping up heat around structures. Another mapping mission today if weather cooperates. 2 BLM cabins remain closed. Concerns -snags, wet roads. No needs and no resources available for reassignment.</p>
<p>8 Fire: Southwest Area IC: Seth Ross</p>	<p>60 fires, 4 staffed In demobe mode. Minor injuries but nothing significant.</p>
