332205 T30N R059W S24 S 06/01/93
Private A/C N197A reported it through Bethel flight service as 50 miles SW of Kotlick. J-78 out of PAQ started for it and then was diverted to B206. T-32 also started out for this one, and was then diverted to B206. J-48 was rolled towards fire and dropped all 8, J-17 split a load between B213 and this one. Strong winds over the fire prompted the request for a third load, which was responded to by J-78 with another 8 jumpers on the fire. T-124 dispatched to the fire and recovered GAL.

T30N R059W S24 S 06/01/93
Phoned in at 1503 by Nulato villager. Gussed fire SW of Nulato in hill, giving off blue smoke, light and variable. J-78 diverted from B205 to respond to this fire. T-32 also diverted from B205. Air Attack 685 ordered on this number along with our medium heicopter 83AH. We have direct commo with the fire on gold. Sent out 1 FSS to hire Nulato crew and ferried to the fire via 83AH. The plan was to bed the crew down for the night and have jumpers work through and then switch out around 0500 and demobe jumpers around 1000 6/2.

Reported by Koyuk VPSO as 7 miles NNE. 15 Mph N wind, in tundra. Downpour around fire. Dispatched J-17 with a load of SMJs to the fire, diverted J-17 to B213. 64U estimated it at 100 acres next to a lake, with 50% of the perimeter active. J-48 flew over it on a barrel run and reported the fire in a skinny line surround by water which could be out by morning.

Fire reported by local villager as burning 0.5 Miles south of Pilot Station in dead grass and timber, with light winds and a white smoke. J-17 originally headed for B209 diverted to this fire. Fire was burning all directions and 50 feet from the runway. All 12 aboard, including the pilots, worked the fire while the villager watched, 4 SMJ's stayed. Expect fire to be out 1200 6/2.

 THE ATMOSPHERE IS MORE UNSTABLE TODAY THAN YESTERDAY. THEREFORE WE
 EXPECT AN INCREASE IN LIGHTNING ACTIVITY.

THERMAL TROUGH EXTENDS FROM NEAR BETHEL TO NEAR FAIRBANKS TO NEAR
 DAWSON AND SHOULD BE ACTIVE TODAY. THE UPPER RIDGE OF HIGH PRESSURE
 HAS RECEDED OVER THE YUKON TERRITORY TODAY BUT WILL AGAIN BUILD
 OVER ALASKA THURSDAY AND FRIDAY. A SURFACE HIGH OVER SOUTHEAST
 ALASKA WILL MOVE OVER THE PRINCE WILLIAM SOUND AREA BY THURSDAY
 AFTERNOON. THIS HIGH HAS COMBINE WITH A LOW SOUTH OF KODIAK ISLAND
 TO PRODUCE ONSHORE FLOW OVER SOUTH CENTRAL ALASKA AND LOW LEVEL
 MOISTURE HAS MOVED OVER MOST OF THE COASTAL AREAS. THIS MOISTURE
 HELD THE MAXIMUM TEMPERATURES DOWN IN SEWARD HOMER AND KENAI
 YESTERDAY AND HAS NOW MOVED FURTHER UP THE INLET TO THE ANCHORAGE
 AREA.

IN THE LONGER TERM..LOOK FOR A FRONT MOVING ONSHORE OVER SOUTHWEST
 AND SOUTH CENTRAL ALASKA SATURDAY AFTERNOON BRINGING SOME RAIN TO
 THESE AREAS. EARLY NEXT WEEK HIGH PRESSURE WILL REDEVELOP OVER
 SOUTH CENTRAL ALASKA.

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
Wednesday 6/2/93 0530 MDT
Preparedness Level I

ALASKA: Initial attack activity.

NORTHWEST: No significant activity.

CALIFORNIA NORTH ZONE: No activity.

CALIFORNIA SOUTH ZONE: Initial attack activity.

NORTHERN ROCKIES: Initial attack activity.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN: No activity.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN: No significant activity.

SOUTHWEST: Initial attack and large fire activity.

Lake, Roswell District, BLM - 300 acres. Fire is threatening oil wells. Heavy fuels and access hamper control efforts. Containment expected 6/2.

Santa Claus, Phoenix District, BLM - 1,780 acres. Contained.

Red Lake, Phoenix District, BLM - 240 acres. Contained.

Martin, Las Cruces District, BLM - 1,500 acres. Containment was expected 6/1.

Escondido, Las Cruces District, BLM - 4,500 acres. Containment expected 6/2.

Mashed O, Las Cruces District, BLM - 11,900 acres. Containment expected 6/2.

El Paso Draw, Las Cruces District, BLM - 700 acres. Containment expected 6/2.

Cockelburr, Las Cruces District, BLM - 750 acres. Containment expected. 6/2.

The Southwest Area has 7 fires for 2,819 acres in confinement status.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN: No significant activity.

EASTERN: No significant activity.

SOUTHERN: No significant activity.

ANALYSIS: The Southwest Area continued to experience significant initial attack activity. Red Flag conditions, coupled with high to very high indices persisted. Predicted winds for the Flagstaff and Grand Canyon area did not materialize. Minimal initial attack activity occurred throughout the remainder of the U.S.

PROGNOSIS: A Red Flag Watch for winds in northwestern Arizona continues. New Mexico is approaching a Red Flag Watch for winds. Activity is expected to continue in the Southwest Area as a result of high temperatures, winds to 40 mph and high to very high indices. Initial attack activity is expected to increase in southern California as temperatures increase.
