DESERT, Arizona State, - 1,000 acres. Homes threatened. No other  
information available.

BLACK RANGE COMPLEX, Gila NF - 16,949 acres. Type I Team (Denton)  
committed. The complex consists of the BELL, BLACKHAWK, INDIAN, MILLER,  
STONE and WHISKEY fires. Demobilization of the complex is underway. With  
the WHISKEY, BLACKHAWK, INDIAN and MILLER fires being contained and the  
BELL and STONE fires being managed under confinement strategy. The team  
turned the fires over to the district.

SH, Gila NF - 26,000 acres. Burnout operations continue to keep the  
fire within confinement strategy boundaries. Containment expected 6/21.

GILLESPIE, Las Cruces, BLM - 1,980 acres. Contained.

**ROCKY MOUNTAIN:** No significant activity.

**EASTERN:** No significant activity.

**SOUTHERN:** Initial attack activity and large fire activity.

GNAT CATCHER, Okefenokee NWR - 3,000 acres. Type I Team (Mann) committed.  
Unified Command in place; Georgia State, Florida State, FWS.  
Inaccessibility and hazardous fuels are hampering control efforts. Private  
property, timber and wildlife habitat continue to be threatened. No  
estimate of containment.

**CANADA:** Initial attack and large fire activity.

DEER, Saskatchewan - 197,680 acres. Light showers and lower temperatures  
have aided suppression efforts. No estimate of containment.

**ANALYSIS:** Fire activity in Alaska and the Southwest areas has moderated with  
demobilization in progress. Increased initial attack activity is occurring in  
the Southern Area.

**PROGNOSIS:** Widely scattered afternoon thunderstorms are forecast for Georgia  
and Florida. Alaska may experience an increase in initial attack activity due  
to warmer temperatures and scattered afternoon thundershowers. A slight chance  
of afternoon thunderstorms for southeast New Mexico could cause some initial  
activity in the Southwest Area.
