ALASKA: Initial attack and large fire activity.

332248, Tanana Zone, Alaska State - 7,148 acres. No estimate of containment.

NORTHWEST: No significant activity.

CALIFORNIA NORTH ZONE: No activity.

CALIFORNIA SOUTH ZONE: Initial attack activity.

SHELL, San Luis Obispo County, California State - 1,200 acres. Contained.

NORTHERN ROCKIES: No activity.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN: No activity.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN: No significant activity.

SOUTHWEST: Initial attack and large fire activity.

POWERLINE, Pima Agency, BIA - 250 acres. Controlled.

MASSACRE, Tonto NF - 700 acres. Threats are to the Dutchman State Park, wilderness. Control problems are heavy loading of light fuels, high temperatures, and low relative humidities. No estimate of containment.

WICKIUP, Phoenix District, BLM - 130 acres. No estimate of containment.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN: No significant activity.

EASTERN: No activity.

SOUTHERN: Initial attack and large fire activity.

GNAT CATCHER, Okefenokee NWR - 5,711 acres. Type I Team (Mann) committed. The fire is managed under a unified command, with representation from Georgia State, Florida State, and the FWS. Control problems are inaccessibility and hazardous fuels. Efforts concentrated on protection to red-cockaded woodpecker colony protection. No estimate of containment.

NEW RIVER, Apalachicola NF - 150 acres. No estimate of containment. ✓

CANADA: Initial attack and large fire activity.

DEER, Saskatchewan - 210,035 acres. No estimate of containment.

ANALYSIS: Demobilization is continuing on fires in Alaska. The Southwest Area, California and Florida experienced increased initial attack activity.

PROGNOSIS: Expect moderate initial attack activity in Florida and southern Georgia with forecast for scattered thundershowers. Minimal initial attack activity is expected in Alaska with thundershowers likely in the northwest, and afternoon thunderstorms with some dry lightning across the central portion of the state. Expect initial attack activity to increase as high pressure builds across southern California and the Southwest Area.
