...WEATHER SYNOPSIS AND MAP DISCUSSION...

A LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM CENTERED OVER THE SOUTHEAST BERING SEA JUST EAST OF THE PRIBILOF ISLANDS SHOULD DRIFT SLOWLY NORTHWARD ALONG THE BERING SEA COAST TODAY AND SUNDAY. A WEAKENING OCCLUDED FRONT IS JUST SOUTH OF THE CENTRAL GULF COAST AND TO THE SOUTHEAST OVER THE EASTERN GULF OF ALASKA. CLOUDINESS AND SCATTERED SHOWERS WILL PERSIST OVER SOUTHWESTERN SECTIONS OF THE STATE THROUGH SUNDAY. CLOUDINESS AND SHOWERS WILL BE LESS EXTENSIVE UNDER A WEAK HIGH PRESSURE RIDGE OVER EASTERN MOST SECTIONS. SOUTH CENTRAL SECTIONS WILL BE IN THE TRANSITION AREA BETWEEN THE MORE MOIST AREA TO THE WEST AND SLIGHTLY DRIER CONDITIONS TO THE EAST. AFTERNOON AND EVENING CONVECTIVE SHOWERS OR THUNDERSTORMS ALONG AND NEAR THE THERMAL TROUGH WILL BE MAINLY TO THE NORTH OF THE SOUTHERN REGION. HOWEVER ...THERE WILL BE A SLIGHT CHANCE OVER NORTHERN MOST SECTIONS OF THE COPPER RIVER VALLEY TODAY AND SUNDAY. ADDITIONALLY COLD AIR ALOFT UNDER THE UPPER LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM IN THE SOUTHWEST MAY SET OFF A FEW THUNDERSTORMS OVER THE YUKON-KUSKOKWIM DELTA AND WESTERN MOST SECTIONS OF THE KUSKOKWIM VALLEY THIS AFTERNOON OR EVENING AND AGAIN SUNDAY AFTERNOON.

WEATHER SYNOPSIS AND MAP DISCUSSION.

CLOUDIER, COOLER, AND GENERALLY MORE STABLE FOR ALL AREAS THROUGH THIS WEEKEND.

THE THERMAL TROUGH HAS MOVED NORTH OF THE BROOKS RANGE. AS A RESULT, ANY THUNDERSTORM ACTIVITY SHOULD BE LIMITED TO NORTH OF TANANA, THE YUKON FLATS, AND POSSIBLY THE KOBUK AREA AS WELL, BUT WILL BE MUCH DECREASED FROM YESTERDAY.

FOR THE REST OF THE ZONES AND THE NORTHERN REGION, A STABLE MARITIME AIRMASS IS EXPECTED AS A WEAK TROUGH ROTATING AROUND AN UPPER LEVEL LOW IN THE BRISTOL BAY AREA PASSES FROM SOUTH TO NORTH TONIGHT AND TOMORROW. DOWNSLOPE WINDS OFF THE ALASKA RANGE WILL KEEP THE SOUTHERN HALF OF THE TANANA ZONE AND THE NORTHERN REGION DRIER, BUT EVEN IN AREAS EXPOSED TO THE FULL, MOIST, SOUTHERLY FLOW WILL NOT RECEIVE MUCH PRECIPITATION. THE MAIN EFFECT OF THIS WEATHER PATTERN IS FOR COOLER AND MORE HUMID CONDITIONS WITH THE GREATEST THREAT OF PRECIPITATION IN THE SOUTHERN HALF OF GALENA, NORTH OF TANANA THROUGH BETTLES, TETLIN AREA, FORTY MILE, AND POSSIBLY THE WHITE MOUNTAINS.

UPPER YUKON ZONE AND NORTHERN REGION
 CLDS/WX.. MOSTLY SUNNY YUKON FLATS WITH A CHANCE OF ISOLATED AFTERNOON THUNDERSTORMS. 
