INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
MONDAY 06/06/94 0530 MDT  
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

**Current Situation:** Initial attack activity continued in southern California and the Southwest Area. Large fire suppression continued in Arizona and northern California. Mobilization of resources consisted of four Type I crews, a caterer and miscellaneous overhead.

**Miller Fire -** Type I team (Denton) committed. The objective is to protect private land and residences. Some homes were evacuated yesterday, quick action prevented any structure loss.

**Mule Fire -** A prescribed natural fire declared a wildfire due to exceeding prescription parameters.

**Dagger Fire -** A local Type II team has been mobilized.

**Outlook:** A RED FLAG WATCH is posted for Arizona and Colorado for gusty winds and low humidity. An area of low pressure over the western U.S. will bring widely scattered, dry thunderstorms this evening to southern California, Colorado and the Southwest Area. Fire activity is expected to increase due to Red Flag conditions coupled with dry thunderstorms. The Southern Area coastal states will have a moist southeast flow that will trigger numerous afternoon thunderstorms. Expect initial attack activity to continue.

...WEATHER SYNOPSIS AND MAP DISCUSSION...

A WEAKENING CENTER OF LOW PRESSURE NEAR DUTCH HARBOR REMAIN NEARLY STATIONARY TODAY THEN WILL DRIFT SOUTH. THE ASSOCIATED FRONT HAS MOVE OVER THE WESTERN GULF OF ALASKA WITH ITS NORTHERN PORTION DISSIPATING OVER BRISTOL BAY EARLIER THIS MORNING. THE REMAINING PORTION OF THE FRONT WILL CONTINUE EASTWARD ACROSS THE SOUTHERN GULF OF ALASKA DISSIPATING AS IT MOVES ON SHORE ALONG THE PAC NORTHWEST COAST. A TROUGH OF LOW PRESSURE ACROSS THE INTERIOR NORTH OF THE ALASKA RANGE PERSIST TODAY KEEPING CONDITIONS UNSTABLE OVER THE INTERIOR AND SOUTH CENTRAL ALASKA. A BUILDING RIDGE OF HIGH PRESSURE OVER THE NORTHEAST GULF COAST IS PRODUCING A WEAK ON SHORE FLOW THAT HAS SPREAD LOW LEVEL MOISTURE OVER THE KENAI PENINSULA AND LOWER COOK INLET. THE RIDGE WILL CONTINUE TO BUILD WESTWARD ACROSS THE GULF COAST MERGING WITH A WEAK RIDGE OVER SOUTHWEST ALASKA LATE TONIGHT. CONDITIONS WILL DRY OVER THE KENAI PENINSULA AND COOK INLET TODAY WITH SCATTERED SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS ALONG THE ALASKA AND TALKEETNA RANGES.
