...WEATHER SYNOPSIS AND MAP DISCUSSION...

A LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM IS SOUTH OF THE STATE WITH ONE CENTER SOUTH OF KODIAK ISLAND AND A SECOND CENTER SOUTH OF DUTCH HARBOR. A DISSIPATING STATIONARY FRONT EXTENDS NORTHWARD FROM THE WESTERN CENTER OVER THE KUSKOKWIM DELTA TO THE NORTON SOUND COASTAL AREA. THE THERMAL LOW PRESSURE TROUGH EXTENDS FROM EAST OF THE SEWARD PENINSULA ACROSS THE FAIRBANKS AREA THEN ON EAST ACROSS THE EAGLE AREA INTO THE CANADIAN YUKON. HIGH PRESSURE RIDGES NORTHWARD OVER THE EASTERN GULF OF ALASKA INTO THE LOWER COPPER RIVER AREA AND WESTWARD INTO THE MATSU AND KENAI PENINSULA AREAS. A SMALL HIGH PRESSURE IS OVER THE SAINT LAWRENCE ISLAND AREA IN THE BERING SEA. MORE SUBSTANTIAL HIGHS ARE OVER THE EASTERN ARCTIC OCEAN AND SOUTH OF THE WESTERN ALEUTIANS OVER THE PACIFIC. NOT MUCH CHANGE IS EXPECTED IN THE WEATHER SYSTEMS TODAY OR WEDNESDAY. MOISTURE WILL REMAIN RATHER HIGH OVER SOUTHWESTERN ALASKA ALONG THE OLD FRONTAL BOUNDARY AS WELL AS ALONG THE WESTERN PORTIONS OF THE SOUTH CENTRAL COASTAL AREAS DUE TO MOIST ONSHORE FLOW AROUND THE TOPSIDE OF THE LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM.

SCATTERED AFTERNOON AND EVENING CONVECTIVE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS ARE EXPECTED ALONG AND NORTH OF THE ALASKAN RANGE AS WELL AS SOUTHWARD OVER THE COPPER RIVER AREA.
