 KEPT THE FIRE MOVING ALONG IN THE GERSTLE BISON FIELDS INTERIOR
 BLOCK MOST OF THE DAY. THE HALF OF THE WESTERN INTERIOR BLOCK OF
 TIMBER HAD BURNED BY 2400. YESTERDAYS ACTIVITY ON THE SE TIP SEEMS
 TO BE GOING OUT AS IT CLIMBS UP A GRADUAL SLOPE. THE KC97 DROPPED
 1/2 LOAD ON THE NW TIP AND 3-1/2 LOADS ON THE MAIN FINGER THAT WAS
 MOVING NORTH LAST EVENING AND THIS MORNING (8/11). CREWS MADE
 QUICK GAINS AND TIED IN THE LINES FROM EAST AND WEST OF THE BRUSH
 LINE. WORK REMAINS TO WIDEN THE FUEL BREAK AND TO STRAIGHTEN IT.
 ENGINE CREWS WORKED AND MOPPED IN 25' NEAR THE 1399 ROAD. MUCH OF
 THE LINE FROM THE ALCAN HIGHWAY FIRE EDGE HAS FIRE HOSE ALONG IT.
 PORTA-TANKS WERE MOVED IN TO THE 1400.3 MILE ROAD WHERE THE FIRE IS
 THE CLOSEST TO PRIVATE LAND. SOME BURN OUT OF LINE WAS
 ACCOMPLISHED IN THE SE QUADRANT OF THE JUNCTION OF THE FIRE LINE
 AND ROAD 1399. THE NENANA CREW ARRIVED AND WORKED ALONG THE FUEL
 BREAK IN THE LATE AFTERNOON. 3 MORE WATER TENDERS ARRIVED. MOST
 OF THE FUEL BREAK SHOULD HAVE HOSE ALONG IT BY THE END OF THE SHIFT
 ON 8/12. A DOZER HAS BEEN PREPOSITIONED OFF THE SOUTH END OF ROAD
 1400.3 TO HELP WITH ANY SPOTS OR SLOPOVERS ON 8/12. +266 ACRES

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
FRIDAY, AUGUST 12, 1994 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL V

Current Situation: Increased initial attack activity was experienced through most of the west yesterday. Large fires burned actively, with a new fire requiring a Type I Incident Management Team in Northern California.

Colonel Anthony Palermo USMC, is the Task Force Commander of the two Marine Battalions assigned to the Tyee fire. Colonel William T. Maddox, USA, is the Task Force Commander for two Engineer Battalions and one Aviation Group assigned to the Corral Creek and East Fork Chamberlin fires and the Idaho City Complex.

Eastern Great Basin Area Large Fires:

CORRAL CREEK, Payette NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Johnson) is committed. The 14th Engineer Battalion, 555 Engineer Brigade, (Lt. Col. Perrennot, Commander) is committed. Helicopter support is being provided by the 4th Battalion, 227 Aviation Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division. Structure protection is continuing on both sides of the Salmon River. The fire made no major runs yesterday.

BLACKWELL COMPLEX, Payette NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Birch) is committed. The complex is comprised of the BLACKWELL and 10 smaller fires. The voluntary evacuation of the residents of Burgdorf, Secesh and Warren continues. Structure protection plans are ongoing including extensive foaming in Burgdorf. Torching and spotting occurred to the north and east of the fire.

IDAHO CITY COMPLEX, Boise NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Liebersbach) is committed. The 20th Engineer Battalion, 1st Cavalry Division, USA (Lt. Col. Bruce Porter, Commander) is committed. Helicopter support is being provided by the 4th Battalion, 227 Aviation Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division. The complex consists of the BANNACK, BEAR RIVER, RABBIT CREEK and numerous other small fires.

THUNDERBOLT, Boise NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Butler) is committed. A thunderstorm with strong winds and spotty precipitation caused slopovers on the north and west sides of the fire.

POWERLINE, Salmon NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Barber) is committed. Acreage increase is due to better mapping. The fire received significant rain.

Northwest Area Large Fires:

SNAKE RIVER COMPLEX, Wallowa-Whitman NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Phenix) is committed. This complex is comprised of the THORN CREEK, RAPID RIVER, TRIANGLE MOUNTAIN, SADDLE CREEK, HAAS HOLLOW, and SWAMP CREEK fires. The Rapid River increased in size again yesterday due to high winds. The fire has advanced to within 2 miles of the Seven Devils Campground and Guard Station.

BOUNDARY, Wallowa-Whitman NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Johnson) is committed. The fire is located 20 miles southeast of Ukiah, OR. It started on the Umatilla NF and

burned onto the Wallowa-Whitman NF, which is now taking over the fire. The western flank is located within the North Fork of the John Day Wilderness.

HATCHERY COMPLEX, Wenatchee NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Porter) is committed. Five CH-47 helicopters from the 214th Aviation Unit, Fort Lewis, WA are assigned. The complex is comprised of the ALPINE LAKES, HATCHERY, RAT CREEK and LOWER VALLEY fires. Acreage increase is due to better mapping of the fires.

OKANOGAN COMPLEX, Okanogan NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Monahan) is committed. The complex is comprised of the POORMAN, THUNDER, WAR CREEK, BURNT SAW RAINBOW/BOULDER/ BUTTE, and MISC. ABC fires.

METHOW COMPLEX, Okanogan NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Harbour) is committed. Good progress was made towards containment of the Whiteface fire. Washington National Guard Troops arrived relieving 10 crews that were at the end of their 21 day tour.

TYEE COMPLEX, Wenatchee NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Wands) is committed. The 5th Battalion, 11th Marine Regiment (Lt. Col. Rick Lindsey, Commander) and the 1st Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment (Lt. Col. Dave Bonwit, Commander) are assigned. Fire activity has become more active with higher temperatures and lower humidities. Flare-ups, single trees torching and short runs were observed in unburned islands. Crews are being rotated out at the end of 21 days.

INDIAN ROCK, Malheur NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Lindsey) is committed. Spotting up to a 1/2 mile occurred. Afternoon winds have caused the fire to jump the line.

TRAIL, Bitterroot NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Wetzsteon) is committed. Good progress continued to be made.

SAM GROUP, Clearwater NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Cowin) is committed. This complex consists of the SAM, HIDDEN-FIX, and the MINNESAKA fires. Cooler weather is helping the crews in efforts on these three fires. The Sam fire is 125 acres and contained and the Hidden-Fix is 260 acres and 75% contained. The Minnesaka fire continues to have flareups and spotting outside the control lines.

SUMMER CREEK, Crow Agency, BIA. A Type II Incident Management Team (Suenram) is committed.

BORDER, Bitterroot NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Spradlin) is committed. The fire received high winds, rain, and hail yesterday. Demobilization of resources will begin today.

EAST FORK CHAMBERLIN, Montana State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Forrester) is committed. The 3/82nd Field Artillery Battalion, 1st Cavalry Division (Lt. Col. Marcus Dudley) is assigned. All Army companies are mopping up and reinforcing the fireline. Demobilization of agency personnel is underway.

BITTER-NEZ, Bitterroot NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bullis) is committed. The complex consists of the SADDLE, MAGRUDER, NICK and WAHOO fires. Precipitation was received
