WEATHER SYNOPSIS AND MAP DISCUSSION.
 THE SURFACE HIGH PRESSURE SYSTEM THAT HAS BEEN OVER MAINLAND ALASKA HAS BROKEN INTO ONE CELL OVER THE LOWER CANADIAN YUKON AND TO EAST AND A SECOND ...MUCH LARGER...CELL OVER THE MIDDLE ALEUTIANS. A WEAK RIDGE OF HIGH PRESSURE EXTENDS BETWEEN THE TWO CELLS ALONG THE ALASKAN PENINSULA...LOWER MATSU VALLEY-KENAI PENINSULA AREA AND ON EAST OVER THE COPPER RIVER AREA. THIS HAS WEAKENED AND SHIFTED WINDS TO A SOUTHERLY DIRECTION ACROSS SOUTH CENTRAL ALASKA. THE HIGH SHOULD MAINTAIN A DRY WEATHER PATTERN OVER THE SOUTH CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST AREAS TODAY. HOWEVER...MOISTURE IS EXPECTED TO MOVE IN OVER THE CENTRAL BERING SEA COAST BRING A CHANCE OF SHOWERS INTO THE KUSKOKWIM VALLEY AREA BY EVENING. A MORE SUBSTANTIAL LOW AND FRONTAL SYSTEM SHOULD MOVE OVER THE WEST BRINGING A CHANCE OF RAIN OR SHOWERS ON OVER MID SECTIONS OF THE SOUTH BY FRIDAY AFTERNOON. TO THE NORTH A LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM MOVING EAST OVER THE ARCTIC IS DRAGGING A COLD FRONT AND ASSOCIATED MOISTURE OVER NORTHERN ALASKA.
