








## Fire Acres Timeline – April 1<sup>st</sup> – Sept 15<sup>th</sup>





Fires by Protecting Unit and Cause







# FILLED CREW ORDERS FOR ALASKA FIRES





# Suppression Module (SMOD) Orders



#### AK 2023 Season Notes

- Some blueberries had been picked and frozen before the first lightning fire bust
- ~2,000 acres burned before July 15
- ~300,000 acres burned after July 15
- More than 18,000 lightning strikes occurred across Alaska on July 24, igniting 30 new fires
- AK reported 6th coldest April on record
- Fairbanks reported third warmest summer on record
- Delta reported second largest fire season to 2004

- The numbers represented are a moment in time and subject to change. All fires and acres are current as of 9/15/2023.
- Where perimeters exist, perimeter acreage was used over user entered acres in the event of a discrepancy.
- Resource data gathered from IROC reports or in some cases, Subject Matter Experts.
- Acres are rounded where applicable for simplicity sake.
