Subject: 2025 Alaska Incident Management Team (IMT) Application Announcement

The Alaska Geographic Area has a goal of staffing three standing Complex Incident Management Teams (CIMT) for the 2025 fire season. The three CIMTs are expected to support Alaska and other incidents across the Nation. The Alaska IMT will begin accepting 2025 applications on August 1, 2024 through the Alaska IMT Application System at <https://forms.office.com/g/6B9DkqPxLA>. **ICAP will not be used for the 2025 Alaska IMT Applications.**

The application period for the Incident Commander, Deputy Incident Commander, and Incident Commander trainee applicants opens August 1, 2024 and closes October 11, 2024. In addition, all Incident Commander applicants must submit a letter of intent to their respective agency AWFCG Operations Committee member by October 11, 2024.

The application period for Command and General Staff (C&G) and all other positions opens August 1, 2024 and closes January 17, 2025.

Your participation as a primary, job share, alternate, or trainee team member is important on a statewide and national level. We are highly encouraging primary and job share positions amongst C&G positions to foster continual growth and customer services of the Alaska IMT. We hope to see increased participation and individual advancement as Alaska's IMT program continues to grow.

Team applications must be received prior to these deadlines to be considered in the 2025 Alaska IMT primary selection and trainee prioritization process. Applications for all positions will continue to be accepted after these deadlines but may not be considered in the selection and prioritization process. Late applications will be placed in Alternate Pools, unless required to fill vacant C&G positions.

ICs and IC Trainees will be selected by AWFCG during their October meeting. In January 2025, Incident Commanders and the AWFCG Operations Committee will select primary C&G for three Complex IMTs from the applicant pool. C&G will select remaining core IMT members and prioritize trainee applications by February 14, 2025.

All primary selections will be made annually for a one-year term; however, consideration will be given to maintaining continuity within C&G positions for three years. Applicants may apply as a primary team member for multiple teams but may only be selected as a primary for a single IMT.

Applicants will be notified of their status by March 1, 2025. Alaska Incident Management Training will be held later that month. The training serves as an annual refresher on mobilization and operating procedures. It will include section breakouts and provide an opportunity to meet fellow team members and prepare for the fire season.
